CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE

The B.C. Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Program is led by the B.C. Wildlife Health Program and supported by a wide group of agencies and BC residents who are concerned about this important disease. Program initiatives continue in response to heightened awareness from new positive cases in deer, elk and moose in Alberta. The Program focuses on preventing the introduction of CWD to BC through early detection, education and outreach to the public and hunting community to ensure that CWD does not become a problem for deer species in British Columbia.

No Positives!

Since 2002 the BC CWD Program has tested 2756 deer, elk and moose heads. These heads include both hunter harvests and road killed animals. CWD has not been identified in any BC samples to date, but continued surveillance is required to confirm that BC is CWD free.

Be Aware of the Risks

If you hunt in areas where CWD infects wild deer, DO NOT BRING HIGH RISK MATERIAL

BACK TO BC. Infected material can contaminate soil and infect BC wildlife.
